Chairman's Message - 2023

It was great to return to some form of normality in 2022 with all formats of National Counties cricket played and again for us, it was a season of what might have been!

There has been a lot of work going on behind the scenes and I am pleased to say that we have three new associate sponsors in Pymm & Co Estate Agents, Holden Kia Motors and MacInnes Whisky. We are most grateful to the business owners Steve Pymm, Tim Holden and Jon Hook for their backing. They join main sponsors MCB Financial Services and Norwich Accountancy Services along with our other associates Howes Percival and IFD Group as key financial partners to whom we are most grateful for their financial support. Thanks also to all our handbook advertisers.

You will see some improvements at Manor Park with an upgrade to the two main scoreboards and there has been a lot of work carried out on the wicket and outfield. We welcome along a new groundsman in Chris Brook who has already put in a lot of hours over the winter months.

Former chief curator Robert Snelling has stood down after many years of excellent service and I would like to extend our sincere thanks for all his endeavors.

Another disappointing white ball campaign was followed by a championship finale on the last day of the tournament when we were two wickets away from clinching the Eastern Division title. A feeling of déjà vu springs to mind as we had been in similar positions in the two previous completed championship seasons. We entered the final day with all options open ranging from relegation to group champions or a position of mid-table comfort.

The three-day campaign started in scorching conditions as we headed to Woolpit in July to take on Suffolk looking to gain some revenge for the three defeats we had suffered in white ball cricket. A dominant batting display on the first day saw Norfolk amass 401 for 6 from their 90 overs. Alfie Cooper became the first batsman in Norfolk's championship history to score a century on debut and he was supported by Sam Arthurton (85) with half centuries from Freddie Fairey and Tom New. Norfolk went on to bowl the home side out for 125 with Brett Stolworthy claiming his first "five for." On another hot second day Norfolk piled on the agony for Suffolk rattling up 225 without loss including a maiden century for Ethan Metcalf and another for Sam Arthurton. Norfolk ensured there was no fight back on day three wrapping up victory straight after lunch as Suffolk fell for 214. Ryan Findlay helped himself to five wickets.

Despite the wonderful summer weather, we were enjoying the players, officials and supporters arrived at Leek amazed to see a green outfield. This was as good as it got as the game against Staffordshire was washed out without a ball being bowled.

Sandwiched in between the championship fixtures was the eagerly awaited showcase game against Nottinghamshire that was cancelled due to Covid in 2020 and 2021. The day was a huge let down because of the weather. Having seen no rain in Norfolk for weeks it decided to appear and destroy what promised to be an intriguing challenge. Nottinghamshire brought a strong side and chose to bat first. Andy Hanby with two early wickets reduced Notts to 11 for 2 and when Callum Metcalf claimed the third wicket on 36 the visitors were teetering. They had progressed to 69 when rain came forcing the players to take an early lunch. With heavy rain falling play was abandoned at 2.45 p.m.

The festival started with a home game against Bedfordshire who batted first amassing 393 for 8. It was a different when Norfolk went to the crease and with the wicket turning on the first afternoon, we were routed for 131. The follow on was enforced and on a difficult wicket there was a little bit more resistance but not enough to save an innings defeat by 67 runs. Tom Brett took 13 wickets in the match for Beds.

Norfolk entered the final game of the season against Lincolnshire who needed six points to secure the title with Norfolk still in with a shout. Norfolk batted first and achieved maximum bonus points with a score of 358 for 7. Alfie Cooper with his second century of the summer was the leading light. Andy Hanby took three wickets to reduce Lincs to 61 for 3 at the close on day one. On the second morning Hanby produced career best figures of 8 for 53 as the visitors were all out for 184. Norfolk responded with 235 and another 80 for Cooper to set an unlikely victory target of 413. If Norfolk could bowl out Lincolnshire on the final day both sides would finish on 59 points with Norfolk crowned champions based on a better nett run rate. Alas, it was not to be as Lincolnshire put up a strong rear-guard and held out on 304 for 8.

In sharp contrast the white ball campaign began at a cold Haileybury College with the opening T20 blast games against Hertfordshire on 24th April. A disappointing 41 run defeat in the first game was followed by a comfortable six wicket victory in game two where new skipper Sam Arthurton led from the front with an unbeaten 71. Next up was a home encounter against Suffolk at Manor Park with Norfolk losing both games in miserable fashion. It was followed by a trip to Wisbech where our fortunes did not improve in the first game as we were heavily beaten.

The second game was a different story with a much better display. Batting first and inspired by Sam Arthurton (62) we scored 132 and with a good all round bowling performance dismissed the home side for 106. With nothing at stake for Norfolk we entertained Lincolnshire and shared the spoils. In game one we won in dramatic style off the last ball when overhauling the visitors 146. The second match was a different story as we were heavily beaten by 52 runs. Lincolnshire set 150 and we were never in the race ending on 98 for 7.

The 50 over competition started with a trip down the A11 to Mildenhall to play Suffolk. After a rain delayed start, we batted first and made 229 for 6 from 46 overs. Tom New with 70 and debutant Sam King from Nottinghamshire with 47 ensured we reached a decent total but once Essex opener Nick Browne got into gear supported by first Jack Beaumont and then Ben Claydon there was no doubting the outcome as Suffolk coasted to victory.

On 5th June we welcomed Cambridgeshire to Manor Park, and they registered a score of 226 for 8 from their allotted overs before heavy rain descended and ended the days play.

On the backfoot in the competition we faced the long trek to the well-appointed Boughton Hall to take on Cheshire. Batting first we put 248 on the board from our 50 overs. On a good batting track, it was never going to be enough, and the home side reached their target in 43rd over for the loss of four wickets. The final trophy game was against Shropshire at Manor Park. The boys were determined to finish a disappointing campaign on a high and this they did with an emphatic eight wicket win. There were a lot of positives to take from 2022 with the emergence of Ethan Metcalf and Alfie Cooper to strengthen the top three and several of the younger players getting opportunities that bodes well for the future. The one-day cricket needs to improve, and we are delighted with the signing of Ben Curran (see separate article).

The Lions had a reduced season with only two fixtures completed. The Cambridgeshire game fell victim to rain and the Bedfordshire game was due to be re-arranged after been cancelled due to the extreme heat, but this did not happen. Hertfordshire conceded as they were unable to raise a side. In the two games played there was a convincing victory over Suffolk by nine wickets and in a much closer affair against Essex Development XI we fell 14 runs short of the 288-victory target.

The cricket committee ably led by David Bowker with Head Coach Chris Brown and Captain Sam Arthurton supported by Andy Hanby worked hard and we are appreciative of their efforts. Our scorer Allison Bradnock has done a super job as always.

The festival was a tremendous success with our wonderful secretary Caroline Nunn playing a major role in the organization of the marquee and hospitality. Both Mondays were sold out and the second Sunday saw good numbers for lunch. Richard Pearce brought 92 of his Business Leader Group for a meal and charity match on 24th August raising funds for the Lords Taverners.

Many thanks to Derek Godfrey who has done a super job with the 200 club. He has hung up his boots and we are most obliged to David Browne for taking over. A big thanks to all the helpers on matchdays without whom we could not operate and special thanks to our friends at Horsford for their support.

Sincere thanks to all our generous members who as always have given tremendous support, for which we are most grateful.

My final thanks are reserved for my fellow committee members who have worked diligently throughout the year. We all look forward to seeing you at Manor Park this season!

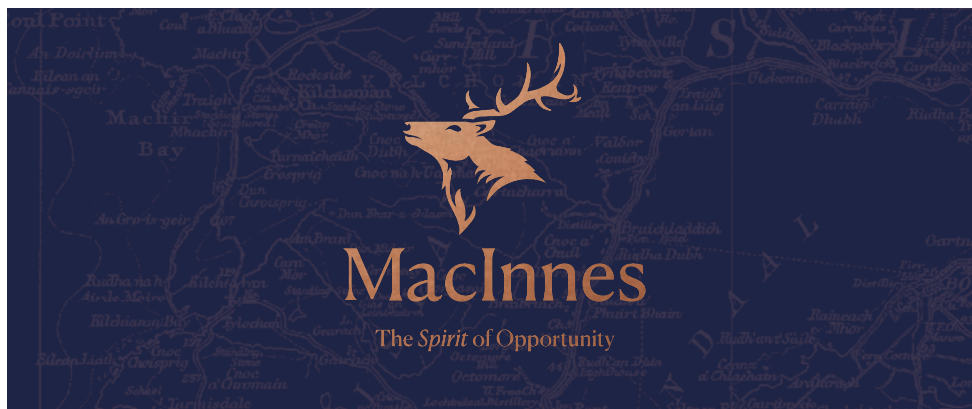

NCCA Trophy – NORFOLK v Suffolk

at Mildenhall on Sunday 29th May 2022

Suffolk won by 9 wickets (Suffolk 2 points, Norfolk 0 points)

It was a miserable start to the campaign for Norfolk at Mildenhall! The weather did not help as morning rain meant that there was no play until 12.30 p.m. and when play commenced the conditions were not great. Having lost the toss Norfolk were asked to bat first in a game that was reduced to 46 overs per side.

Skipper Sam Arthurton (41) and Freddie Fairey (18) put on 40 for the first wicket before Fairey was caught by Tom Rash off Tristan Blackledge. There was then a stand of 52 between Arthurton and Jason Reynolds (26). After both had departed in quick succession Norfolk needed a good innings from professional Tom New who was partnered by Sam King the Nottinghamshire youngster on debut. The pair both played well with King showing his undoubted potential in a knock of 47 from 51 balls including six fours whilst adding 107 with New for the fourth wicket.

New had moved on to an excellent 70 from 63 balls with seven fours and one six before he fell to a catch in the deep going for another six in the 44th over. The Norfolk innings ended on 229 for 6. For the home side Jack Beaumont had 3 for 43 and Tristan Blackledge 2 for 31.

By the time Suffolk started their reply, the weather had changed, and the sun was drying out the wicket. Alistair Cook's opening partner at Essex Nick Browne took first dig along with Beaumont. The pair set off steady with 11 on the board after 5 overs but Norfolk were unable to gain the early breakthroughs required. Browne demonstrating his professionalism was taking no chances whilst Beaumont powered his way to 53 from 45 balls in a stand of 83 for the first wicket.

The wayward Norfolk bowling was making it comfortable for the Suffolk batsmen when Ben Claydon joined Browne at the crease. The pair played well and never really looked in any real danger as they ensured Suffolk had a comfortable passage to victory in an unbroken partnership of 146. They reached the victory target in the 43rd over. Browne was unbeaten on 90 from 110 balls and the impressive Claydon on 80 from 103 balls.

NCCA Trophy - CHESHIRE V NORFOLK

at Chester Boughton Hall on 12th June 2022

Cheshire won by 6 wickets (Cheshire 2 points, Norfolk 0 points)

The Norfolk players made the long trek to Chester following their club games to take on Cheshire at the very well-appointed Boughton Hall CC.

It was the first time the two counties had met since T20 Finals Day on 27th August 2018 at Wormsley when Cheshire were the victors. Prior to that you must go back to 10th August 2000 when they played each other in the semi-final of ECB 38 Cup at Lakenham.

Norfolk won the toss and elected to bat. Skipper Sam Arthurton led from the front with 77 and there were other useful contributions from Freddie Fairy 33, Tom New 38, Alfie Cooper 30 and Ben Wilcox 25 in a Norfolk total of 248 for 8.

Speaking to some of the locals they thought the score was 40 or 50 light and so he proved to be. An excellent unbeaten 103 from Will Evans led the home side to a well-deserved victory in the 43rd over with six wickets to spare.

Norfolk entertained Shropshire in the final group game and as there was nothing at stake for either side Norfolk took the opportunity to blood some youngsters with Ethan Metcalf (aged 17) and Cameron Graveling (18) making their debuts in the 50 over competition. Unfortunately, due to the way the game played out neither got the chance to display their undoubted talent.

As a result of a late call off on Saturday and with no twelfth man Shropshire took the field with only ten men. They had been unable to find a replacement at short notice. Norfolk won the toss and elected to bowl first.

Shropshire made a steady start, and it was in the eight over with the score on 32 when Norfolk got the breakthrough with Andy Hanby bowling Andre Bradford for 10. After this, wickets started to fall at regular intervals as the four-pronged Norfolk seam attack took control. First Brett Stolworthy got in on the act with the wicket of Ben Lees assisted by the first of two catches for Sam King. Callum Metcalf then helped himself to four wickets including the wicket of professional Graham Wagg for a golden duck as the Shropshire innings started to fall apart. Ben Wilcox claimed his third Norfolk wicket in only his second bowling spell and Stolworthy returned to the attack to mop up the last two wickets both to catches by skipper Sam Arthurton as a deflated Shropshire were dismissed for a paltry 96 in 26.3 overs.

There were some good figures in an excellent Norfolk bowling performance supported by some fine catching.

As it was too early for lunch the Norfolk innings started after a ten-minute break. Arthurton opened with Freddie Fairy and the pair had put on 27 for the first wicket when Fairey was caught and bowled by Ben Roberts. Wilcox joined the captain at the crease and featured in a stand of 45 before he was caught by Roberts off the bowling of Charlie Walker for 22. Tom New and Arthurton comfortably guided Norfolk to the victory total from the last ball of the 21st over. Arthurton was unbeaten on 44 from 71 balls including five fours. New was undefeated on 8.

Stephen Musk writes:

Norfolk's first match of the season saw them field three debutants in Alfie Cooper, Will Bowman, and Cameron Graveling. Winning the toss, Sam Arthurton made the obvious choice to bat first and Norfolk dominated from the very start. The skipper was as polished as ever and there were fifties for Tom New and Freddie Fairey (the latter's first in the Championship). However, it was Cooper's maiden innings which really caught the eye. His 126 took just 154 balls as the Suffolk attack was brutalised. With his quicker bowlers being ineffective, Suffolk skipper Jack Beaumont opted to rely heavily on his own slow left-armers and the off-breaks of George Rhodes. Neither had a day to remember.

With 20 overs to bat on the first evening, Suffolk made a poor start and fared no better when recommencing on the second morning. Brett Stolworthy showed that there was something in the wicket for pace bowlers, and was rewarded for his hostility and accuracy with his first five-wicket haul. Graveling, whose slow left-armers were delivered with a distinctive action, chipped in with a couple of wickets as Suffolk were quickly rolled over.

As is the habit these days, Norfolk opted not to enforce the follow on but batted again. The home bowlers had nothing to offer as Ethan Metcalf and Arthurton racked up untroubled centuries. Although both batted well, it was very one-sided and so, to be honest, a little bit dull. When the declaration came, Suffolk's notional target was a whopping 501 runs.

The home side again made a bad start, as Stolworthy again bowled well, dismissing the first three batsmen. Suffolk lost two further wickets before the close. An early finish on the final day was expected and duly took place. At least the home batsmen went down fighting, with Rhodes (not out overnight), Ben Parker, and Andy Northcote all attacking spinners Ryan Findlay and Graveling to some effect before being dismissed. The match would almost certainly have been over before lunch if Arthurton had not awarded himself a bowling spell and served up four overs of extremely unchallenging slow mediums.

The only fly in Norfolk's ointment was the fact that Andy Hanby had picked up an injury which might have ruled him out of the upcoming visit to Staffordshire. It was hoped that he would be fit but rain in the Midlands was to see that match abandoned without any play whatsoever. And so the matter was rendered academic.

Unlike Manor Park, Woolpit lacks an effective P/A system so those of us in the crowd were unaware that Suffolk were obliged to make a replacement on the third morning. Ben Claydon failed a covid test and so Adam Mansfield was allowed to bat in his place.

Stephen Musk writes:

On a fine day at Manor Park, Norfolk included Sam King in their side for the first time. Bedfordshire won the toss and opted to bat first. They started sufficiently briskly that Sam Arthurton called on slow left-armer, Ryan Findlay well before lunch. It immediately became apparent that Rob Snelling had produced a wicket which offered the spin bowlers some encouragement. However this benefitted neither Findlay nor leggie, Charlie Rogers, for the visiting batsmen gave every appearance of 'going after' the spinners with the intention of neutralising their threat. If this was a deliberate ploy it certainly worked. Nearly all of the visiting batsmen made runs and those that did made them briskly. Both Findlay and Rogers ended up with sorry-looking figures. At one point Arthurton was reduced to bowling some slowish full-bungers himself and was unjustly rewarded with a wicket.

Chasing a formidable total, Norfolk lost Arthurton before the close and sent in Andy Hanby, their usual nightwatchman. He survived till the close of play but, on the following morning, he and the rest of the home batting rolled over and died. Bedfordshire's slow left-armer, Tom Brett, bowling with guile and control, fully deserved his splendid analysis and he was well supported by his fellow left-armer, George Darlow. The innings barely lasted for 50 overs, with the two spinners bowling nearly all the overs and taking all the wickets.

Bedfordshire skipper, George Thurstance, opted to invite Norfolk to bat again. Giving paceman, Alex Evans, the new ball as something of a gesture to convention, he was rewarded when the bowler dismissed Arthurton for a rare duck. Following that, the visitors fell back on their spin attack, which claimed the remaining nine wickets between them. Brett was again the star and he finished with career-best figures of 13 for 88 – comfortably beating his previous high of 13 for 243, which he had achieved against Suffolk in 2017. Darlow was mastered, but this time Brett was well supported by the leg-spin of Joe Lowe, who took his first Championship wickets.

Norfolk's second innings lasted longer than their first, but not by much. After Ethan Metcalf was dismissed, Alfie Cooper and Tom New made a dogged stand but, once the former was out, the latter found no-one to stay with him. He was finally dismissed ninth, having resisted for 147 balls, the longest innings of the match. Norfolk were beaten inside two days.

The old cliché goes: 'cricket is a funny game'. Bedfordshire's next (and final) match was against Suffolk. As Bedfordshire had thrashed Norfolk, and Norfolk had walloped Suffolk, the money was probably on Bedfordshire to win easily. However, Suffolk won by 136 runs (and were not at all flattered by that margin). Brett's only wicket cost him 183 runs and his county were relegated.

Stephen Musk writes:

Norfolk went into their final match knowing that they could top the table if they both beat Lincolnshire outright and gained at least four more bonus points than the visitors. A difference of five or more bonus points plus the win would see Norfolk finish with more points in total than Lincolnshire. But a margin of just four and the victory would leave the two counties level on points - in which case Norfolk would be deemed table-toppers by virtue of having a superior nett batting average.

Winning the toss, Norfolk began their quest for maximum batting points. The innings started poorly as Sam Arthurton was dismissed for his second duck in a row. However, Alfie Cooper again impressed with another speedy century, his innings lasting for just 132 balls. Freddie Fairey also stepped on the gas and faced only 88 balls while scoring 61. But, when he was dismissed, Norfolk looked to be in a bit of trouble. At this point both sides had gained three bonus points. This meant that, if Lincolnshire could capture just two more wickets while preventing Norfolk from reaching 325, the visitors would finish at the top of the table regardless of subsequent events. But Charlie Rogers, not normally known for his batting, was sent in at number nine and launched into a spate of big hitting. Aply supported by Brett Stolworthy, he saw an unbeaten 75 runs added for the eighth wicket. This saw Norfolk claim four batting points while Lincolnshire were restricted to three for their bowling. The upshot of this was that Norfolk needed to bowl the visitors out for less than 225 if a subsequent win was to lead them to finish at the top of the table.

That Norfolk were successful in dismissing Lincolnshire sufficiently cheaply was almost all down to Andy Hanby, who put in the best bowling performance seen by Manor Parkers for many a year. Only Sam Evans was able to resist for long and was last out. Given the option to enforce the follow on, Arthurton chose not to do so. Norfolk went for quick runs and the declaration saw the visitors set 413 in what would turn out to be 127 overs. Some spectators thought that this was a tad cautious...

After Norfolk's pacemen claimed three quick wickets, Lincolnshire's middle order dug in. Jack Timby lasted for 128 balls, Ben Wright for 149, and Tom Keast for a most praiseworthy 259. Although Norfolk's slow bowlers toiled, they did not spin, not taking a single wicket between them until the score had reached 268. Only a late flurry of wickets made the result looked closer than it actually was. And so Norfolk narrowly missed out from topping the table for three seasons in succession.

Mike Davage

Stephen Musk writes

I got to know Mike when our mutual love of Norfolk County Cricket brought us together. I was interested mostly in collecting scores and calculating batting and bowling averages while Mike was more concerned with the individuals behind the statistics. His research, which was almost unbelievably thorough, led to the publication of two books detailing the lives of all the players who ever turned out for Norfolk – including as many substitute fielders as possible. These books are far more comprehensive than any produced on any other Minor County and well up to the standard of works concerning first-class counties. But Mike was not a selfish worker – far from it. He was always mustard keen to help anyone who had a query about Norfolk cricketers. For instance, when I asked him to give me some details about the Rought-Rought family, he quickly responded with a family tree going back no fewer than seven generations.
