



Chairman's Message - 2024

Overall, it was a disappointing 2023 season ending with relegation from the East Division One championship in a format that had been our strength in recent years. We did not perform much better in white ball cricket and plans are in place to bring about changes that we hope will lead to a successful campaign in all formats.

In December we said goodbye to Chris Brown who was appointed full-time slow bowling coach for Cricket Ireland. This is a great opportunity for Chris to further his career with an ICC full member nation and is something Chris has been working towards for some time. He goes with our very best wishes and we are most grateful for the outstanding service he has given to Norfolk cricket over the last 22 years.

This has given us the chance to press the reset button and we have appointed Tom New, who has retired from NCCA cricket, and Sam Arthurton as the new coaches. They have their own ideas on the direction of travel, and we wish them both every success in their new roles. Sam will continue to lead the team on the field and Tom will take care of off-field matters as well as working closely with the players.

Following Tom's retirement, I am delighted to say that we have signed Josh Cobb as the new professional. There is an article about Josh and Tom on another page of the handbook.

After the opening T20 game at Bourne against Lincolnshire was called off we took on Hertfordshire at Manor Park on 30th April, losing both games on the day. The one bright spot was a half century by the white ball pro Ben Curran.

Next up was Suffolk at Ipswich School where we comfortably won the first encounter by eight wickets due in the main to an unbroken third wicket stand of 82 by skipper Sam Arthurton (52) and Freddie Fairey (37). The second game of the day was a tight affair that we lost by seven runs despite four wickets for Ryan Findlay. The final fixtures against Cambridge were lost to a waterlogged pitch.

The 50 over Trophy competition started with an emphatic 84 run victory over a strong Cheshire side. Batting first we posted 238 for 3 with good contributions from Alfie Cooper (73), Ben Wilcox (59) and Freddie Fairey (33). Andy Hanby removed five of the top six Cheshire batsmen to ensure victory was never in doubt.

A dismal batting performance against Suffolk at Manor Park saw a heavy defeat and we headed to Shropshire in need of a victory to keep alive hopes of qualifying for the quarter finals. Batting first Norfolk registered 223 for 9 after a late cameo from Ryan Findlay (53 n.o.) but once the Shropshire professional Tom Fell got into his stride it was never going to be enough. The home side got home with fifteen balls to spare and five wickets in hand. The final game was against Cambridgeshire who amassed a challenging 279 for 5. We were never really in the chase despite a maiden fifty from youngster Will Bowman and we succumbed to 207 all out.

The championship began in July with a trip to Tring Park to take on Buckinghamshire. We were in control for large parts of the game after recovering from 122 for 7 in the first innings due to a record eighth wicket partnership of 153 by Callum Metcalf and Brett Stolworthy. Metcalf in an outstanding innings recorded his maiden century batting at number nine and a fine 66 n.o. from Brett Stolworthy helped the final total to 299. We bowled out Bucks for 251 to take a first innings lead of 48. Hudson De Lucchi scored 61 in a second innings total of 195 to set Bucks 244 for victory.

The wicket seemed to get better and hats off to the home side who batted very well and recorded a six-wicket victory.

On 30th July we entertained Nottinghamshire CCC in front of a good crowd in the showcase game and the visitors brought their full Metro Bank Trophy squad. Batting first they showed their quality with a total of 312 for 6 from 50 overs. It was a day to remember for Will Bowman who took three wickets in four balls to reduce Notts to 86 for 3.

The superior talent shone through in the first-class county's bowling attack as Norfolk were bowled out for 129.

It was back to championship cricket for the Norfolk Festival starting with the visit of Staffordshire. Two poor batting displays in each innings led to Norfolk's downfall on a turning wicket. Staffordshire mastered the conditions better to return home with a ten-wicket victory. Suffolk provided the opposition the following week in what proved to be a tight encounter. Norfolk dismissed the visitors for 209 with five wickets for Ryan Findlay who followed up with 67 in a Norfolk

total of 186. In the second innings Suffolk were bowled out for 156 with five wickets from Brett Stolworthy leaving Norfolk a target of 180 to record their first win in the competition in 2023. Tom New with 53 led the victory charge but Norfolk fell agonizingly thirteen runs short.

A good contingent of Norfolk supporters made the journey to Cleethorpes for the must win game against Lincolnshire. Having had Lincolnshire 209 for 8 on day one, they were let off the hook and finished on 317 for 8. Findlay again taking five wickets. Wilcox with 60 and Findlay (51) helped Norfolk to 203 and a first innings deficit of 114 leaving the visitors with a mountain to climb. That mountain got taller as Lincolnshire posted 282, five wickets for Callum Metcalf, leaving Norfolk needing an unlikely 397 to stay in Division One. Tom New, having announced his retirement signed off in style with 76 before Norfolk were bowled out for 213 to confirm their relegation.

The Lions, captained by Charlie Rogers, had a mixed season. The first game against Suffolk at Manor Park was washed out and this was followed by a heavy nine wicket defeat to Bedfordshire. The side bounced back with a four wicket win over Hertfordshire featuring a knock of 65 by Ethan Metcalf. On a very hot day at Sawston, Cambridgeshire rattled up 351 and despite 83 from Ethan Metcalf, Norfolk fell well short. In the final game at Fakenham against Essex, Metcalf led the side to an impressive five wicket victory with an excellent 105 supported by 53 for Jonah Wicks.

We have been paired with Northamptonshire CCC for the showcase game this year and I have met with their CEO Ray Payne and Academy Director Kevin Innes. We have the foundations in place for a prosperous relationship and they are keen to look at some of our young talent with an eye to the future.

The cricket committee with David Bowker at the helm, Head Coach Chris Brown and Captain Sam Arthurton supported by Andy Hanby have all worked hard.

Poor results aside the festival was a great success with the marquee full to overflowing on both Monday's. The second Sunday saw good numbers for lunch and Richard Pearce brought 85 of the Norfolk Business Leader Group for a meal and charity match on 9th August, raising excellent income for the club. There was disappointment on the first Sunday when we were left with no alternative but to cancel the members' tea when play was abandoned for the day in the morning.

The wicket at Manor Park is very much a work in progress and we are in close contact with Horsford CC who are investing heavily to bring about improvements. In order to support the situation, we are playing the T20 and one day games this season at Sprowston CC and Great Witchingham CC. Members will have had a full update on the progress by the time they read this message.

We are most thankful for the support of our sponsors and in particular main sponsors Norwich Accountancy Services and MCB Financial Services and the associate sponsors for 2023 Howes Percival, Pymm & Co, Holden Motors and Woodfordes Brewery.

David Browne has done a super job with the 200 club but due to declining numbers over recent years we may have to re-structure this. A big thanks to those including Horsford members who have helped on match days. It is much appreciated.

A special mention to our wonderful scorer Allison Bradnock, Asa Cohen who live streamed the home games and scorer Andrew Borrett who covered two of the Lions games.

Two of our committee members stood down last year, Caroline Nunn and Ian Ritchie, I would like to thank them both for their contributions. We are delighted to welcome three new committee members, David Reeder (secretary), Sudhir Trivedi (vice-chair) and Jo Durrant. All three bring strong qualities which will be a great benefit to the county.

To all our generous members who as always have given tremendous support throughout the year we are most grateful. You are a major part of the club and the envy of most other counties.

My final vote of thanks is reserved for my fellow committee members who have worked very hard to ensure the smooth running of the club over the last twelve months.

I look forward to seeing you when the season gets underway. Hopefully it will be drier and warmer by then!

Chris Brown



Chris first came to Norfolk's attention in 2000 when he played a vital role in Cheshire's victory in the semi-final of the Minor Counties Trophy, played at Lakenham. Norfolk's Committee were so impressed with his technical ability and competitive attitude that they approached Cheshire, asking if they could sign him up. Foolishly (as it turned out), Cheshire were willing to let him go.


Chris proved to be extremely adept at fulfilling both roles required of an effective off-spinner. On flat tracks, he had the ability, stamina, and (importantly) the willingness to bowl long, containing

spells, preventing the opposition batsmen from running amuck. Presented with a wicket that offered him some assistance, he could run through any batting line-up in the Minor Counties game. It is a measure of his dominance that, whilst he took 480 wickets in the Minor Counties Championship during the 21st century, no other bowler has claimed even 300 victims over the same period. In 2016, Chris won the Frank Edwards Trophy, which is awarded to the bowler with the lowest average in the Championship: he took 38 wickets at an average of 15.34.

As well as being a highly successful bowler, Chris has also become a highly effective coach, qualified to the highest level. His services have been much in demand over the world and now take him away from Norfolk. He goes with our thanks and best wishes.

Few people know that Chris played first-class cricket in Sri Lanka, turning out in four matches for Badureliya Sports Club in 2005/06. He acquitted himself well with the ball and even found himself opening the batting on his debut.

At Manor Park, Chris almost always bowled from the same end. A few years ago the p/a announcer raised a laugh by informing the crowd that "coming on at the Chris Brown End is Chris Brown". Would it not be a fitting tribute to Chris that his end should be officially named after him?





NCCA Trophy 50 overs – NORFOLK v CHESHIRE

at Manor Park on 28th May 2023 at 11am Norfolk won by 84 runs (Norfolk 2 points, Cheshire 0 points)

Norfolk welcomed Cheshire to Manor Park for the opening game of National Counties 50 over Trophy and after winning the toss skipper Sam Arthurton decided to bat first.

They got off to a steady start against some lively bowling from Luke Young and Rob Lord. The first wicket fell on 23 when Ben Curran was run out by an excellent throw from Young. Arthurton followed with the score on 39 when he was adjudged LBW to ex-Glamorgan player Joe Cooke.

Norfolk needed a good partnership and Alfie Cooper and Ben Wilcox both stepped up to the plate. They put on 121 in 26 overs on a wicket that was not easy to score freely on. Wilcox had moved on to 59 when he was run out going for a tight second run. After the loss of Luke Caswell caught by Cooke off Jack Williams, Cooper added 43 with Freddie Fairey before he was bowled by Luke Young for an excellent 76. Fairey struck 33 of 33 balls to help Norfolk to 238 for 6 from their allotted overs.

Luke Young was the pick of the Cheshire bowlers with 2-35 from his ten overs. Both captain and Coach, Chris Brown thought it was a decent score but knew Norfolk would have to bowl well and make early inroads if they were to win.

Cheshire showed intent from the start and Ben Kohler-Cadmore brother of Somerset's Tom set about the bowling hitting five fours in the first four overs before Andy Hanby had him caught by Fairey for 23 with the score on 30. The total had moved onto 41 when Hanby turned the game on its head with a fine spell of bowling. He removed both the Cheshire professionals in the space of five deliveries. First Harry Dearden was caught by Arthurton and then he bowled the dangerous Cooke. When he followed up with the wickets of Henry Dobson caught by keeper Jason Reynolds and trapped Matt Strong LBW Cheshire were in some disarray at 49 for 5 after 11 overs. Hanby had 5-21.

Worse was to follow for Cheshire as Brett Stolworthy got in on the act with the first of his two wickets when Alex Money was caught by Cooper. Much like Norfolk the visitors need a partnership and Pat Ashling (38) and Luke Young (25) responded with a stand of 67. When Ashling was well caught by Caswell at slip off slow left armer Cameron Graveling it was an uphill struggle for Cheshire at 124 for 7.

Wickets by Wilcox, Stolworthy and Graveling wrapped up the innings with the score on 154 in 36th over to give Norfolk an 84-run victory.

Suffolk won by 103 runs (Norfolk 0 points, Suffolk 2 points)

It was disappointment for Norfolk as they suffered a heavy defeat to local rivals Suffolk when they were well beaten by 103 runs.

The day started well for Norfolk despite losing the toss when Andy Hanby bowled Darren Batch with the first ball of the match. Hanby who had completed a hat-trick, all clean bowled with his last three deliveries in the league game on Saturday for Great Witchingham, made it four in four.

Callum Metcalf lifted Norfolk's spirits with two wickets reducing the visitors to 45 for 3. Professional George Rhodes and Alex Oxley (28) added 73 for the fourth wicket before Oxley fell to a brilliant diving caught and bowled by Ryan Findlay. When Brett Stolworthy removed Josh Cantrell, well caught by Jason Reynolds things were looking good for Norfolk with the score on 124 for 5 in 34th over. Rhodes who had held the innings together with 61 from 90 balls then fell to a stunning diving catch by skipper Sam Arthurton off the bowling of Hanby.

When Metcalf claimed the wicket of Jacob Marston and Hanby bowled Adam Mansfield with the total on 161 for 8 Norfolk were in a decent position. However, a fine unbroken partnership of 45 by Tom Harper (18) and Daniel Shanks (29) lifted the final score to 206 for 8. Hanby and Metcalf both had three wickets for Norfolk.

The hosts knew it would be a difficult run chase on a challenging wicket and so it proved to be. An opening partnership of 27 from skipper Arthurton and Ben Curran set Norfolk on their way before Curran was caught by keeper Marston off the bowling of Ben Claydon for 13. Claydon was proving a real handful and took four of the first five wickets to fall as Norfolk were reduced to 61 for 5. Claydon bowled his ten overs straight through to finish with 4 for 24 including the wicket of Arthurton who top scored with 27.

None of the Norfolk batsmen could really get going as the pitch deteriorated and wickets continued to fall on a regular basis as the Suffolk bowlers dominated. The dismal Norfolk batting display ended when they were all out in 33rd over for 103.

Shropshire won by 5 wickets (Shropshire 2 points, Norfolk 0 points)

Despite heavy rain, thunder and lightning on Saturday night the game got underway at 11.00 a.m. as the ground had drained well.

After losing the toss Norfolk batted first on a slow wicket. They got off to a good start with captain Sam Arthurton and Ben Curran putting on 64 for the first wicket before Curran (22) was bowled by slow bowler Charlie Home who was on the books with Curran at Northamptonshire. Ben Wilcox was next to go trapped LBW by the other slow bowler Matt Simmonds with the score on 76. Worse was to follow in the nineties as Norfolk lost three wickets for just two runs. Arthurton ran down the wicket and was stumped by Ben Lees off Simmonds for 28 and both Luke Caswell and Freddie Fairey fell to paceman Jack Home in the same over to leave Norfolk in trouble on 95 for 5.

There were still 27 overs to go, and it was vital that Norfolk tried to bat all their overs. Alfie Cooper and Jason Reynolds set about repairing the damage with a stand of 41 before Reynolds was LBW to Charlie Home and then five runs later Cooper followed him back to the pavilion. Ryan Findlay played very well and supported by Callum Metcalf, Brett Stolworthy and Andy Hanby he made sure Norfolk utilised all the overs as they finished on 223 for nine. Findlay had six fours and one six in his unbeaten 51.

After the break batting seemed a different proposition as Andre Bradford and George Hargrave had put on fifty for the first wicket when Hargrave fell to a catch by Caswell off the bowling of Metcalf for 30. This brought ex Worcestershire man Tom Fell to the crease and along with Bradford they put on a match winning partnership of 147. The elegant Fell played with great composure and rarely looked in danger. He had made 88 when he struck a ball from Hanby to the safe hands of Arthurton. Metcalf then bowled Ollie Westbury and Hanby had Bradford caught by Freddie Fairey for 71. It was a case of too little too late for Norfolk. The final wicket to fall was a stunning diving catch by Hanby from the part-time bowling of Arthurton but that was it as Shropshire deservedly reached their victory target in the 48th over.

at Exning Park on 25th June 2023 at 11am Cambridgeshire won by 72 runs (Cambridgeshire 2 points, Norfolk 0 points)

It was a disappointing end to the One Day Trophy campaign for Norfolk as they lost by 72 runs to Cambridgeshire at a sun soaked Exning Park.

Norfolk found themselves in the field after Cambridgeshire won the toss and elected to bat. They got off to brisk start with 24 runs on the board in the first four overs when Wayne White chopped a ball from Andy Hanby onto his stumps to depart for 14. The early momentum continued for Cambs as Yousef Choudary (44) and Will Routledge (58) added 64 for the second wicket before Choudary was caught by Hanby off the bowling of Callum Metcalf. The introduction of slow bowlers Cameron Graveling and Ryan Findlay help to steady the run flow, and both picked up a wicket.

Lee Thomason was leading the run charge and hit 61 from 51 balls as the home side pressed the accelerator. The return to the attack of Brett Stolworthy saw him pick up four wickets towards the tail end of the innings as Cambridgeshire finished on 292 for 9 from their 50 overs. Stolworthy ended with 4 for 74.

Norfolk promoted Ethan Metcalf to open the batting with skipper Sam Arthurton to give Ben Curran a rest after he had kept wicket in the heat, but Curran was soon at the crease when Arthurton was dismissed in the sixth over with the score on 20. Curran was next to go when he skied a catch to Harrison Craig to give Mohammed Danyaal the first of his four wickets. Alfie Cooper was Danyaal's next victim as he was trapped LBW and when Freddie Fairey was caught and bowled by Callum Guest the writing was on the wall for Norfolk at 82 for 5.

It did allow Will Bowman to take his chance and notch his first half century for Norfolk with a hard hitting 51 that included seven fours. The best partnership of the innings 46 by Stolworthy (32) and Hanby (25 n.o.) helped the score above 200 and gave an air of respectability to the final total of 207 for 9.

The defeat meant that Norfolk finished joint bottom of the group alongside Cambridgeshire with both sides having won just one game.

Buckinghamshire won by 6 wickets (Buckinghamshire 22 points Norfolk 5 points)

Close of play: Day 1 – Buckinghamshire 38 - 2 in 18 overs (Woodland 10 & Kervezee 22) Day 2 – Norfolk 105 - 3 in 32 overs (New 15 & de Lucchi 32)

Norfolk's first championship game was a trip to Tring Park to take on newly promoted Buckinghamshire.

After winning the toss on the first day, Bucks seemed in control, when they reduced Norfolk to 122-7 but a stunning maiden century from 120 balls by Callum Metcalf, who shared in a new eighth-wicket record stand of 153 with Brett Stolworthy (66no), lifted Norfolk to 299-9 from 90 overs. Connor Haddow was the pick of the Bucks bowlers with 5 for 105.

Andy Hanby struck early in the Bucks reply with the wickets of Mohamad Choudhry and Chris Marrow as he reduced Bucks to 11 for 2. Opener AJ Woodland (55) and Alex Kervezee (76) set about repairing the damage in a stand of 126. They were well supported by Ed Bragg (42) and Buckinghamshire debutant Jake Tarling (35) as they were bowled out for 251 in 71.5 overs.

Callum Metcalf followed up his century with three wickets and there was three for the other first innings batting hero Stolworthy.

With a first innings lead of 48, Norfolk struggled to stretch their advantage to match-winning proportions and were bowled out for 195 from 78.5 overs in their second knock. The key contributor was Hudson De Lucchi (61) registering his first half century for the county. Haddow returned his second five-wicket haul to finish with match figures of 10-136.

The main concern for Norfolk was that they had not taken enough overs out of the game as they had set Bucks a target of 244 in a minimum of 60 overs which seemed gettable on a pitch that was improving rather deteriorating.

Opener AJ Woodland sent Bucks on their way with a splendid 91 from 114 balls, his second half-century of the game and he shared a second wicket stand of 79 with Chris Marrow (37). Michael Payne then took on the baton with an unbeaten 54 from 51 balls assisted by a fluent 39 from Ross Richardson, who hit two sixes, as the pair led the hosts to their victory target in the 56th over.

In a poor bowling performance Callum Metcalf claimed two of the four wickets to fall. It was a disappointing start to the campaign in a game that Norfolk were in control for large parts.



Staffordshire won by 10 wickets. (Staffordshire 22 points, Norfolk 4 points)

Close of Play: Day 1 – no play due to bad weather Day 2 – Staffordshire 162 for 4 wkts. [56 overs] (Hill 19, Priestley 7)

Stephen Musk writes:

I arrived at Manor Park bright and early on the first morning Festival – only to find that there had been some localised but heavy rain overnight and the umpires had already decided that no play at all would be possible on the day. It was thought by many (including members of the opposition) that the covers simply weren't up to the standard required for a ground hosting Minor Counties cricket. I returned home fairly sharpish but I gathered that the general impression of those who stayed on was that the umpires had been a little over-cautious in abandoning the whole day and that the square was probably fit for play from about 3.00pm. As I wasn't there, I feel unable to comment further.

When play finally commenced on the second morning, Staffordshire opted to put Norfolk in, presumably thinking that there was something in the undoubtedly still damp pitch to assist the bowlers. It proved to be a good decision as, after right-arm paceman Liam Hurt had dismissed both openers cheaply, the two slow left armers Tom Brett and Anis Raza worked their way through Norfolk's order. Brett was the more successful but could have had even better figures if he hadn't delivered the odd loose delivery. None of the batsmen covered themselves in glory but Charlie Rogers did at least resist stoutly, his innings of 19 lasting for 101 balls.

When the visitors went in, their top order batted soundly. Matthew Morris battled hard for a patient half-century whilst Zen Malik and Michael Hill were more aggressive. Only a prolonged spell of hostile and accurate bowling from Brett Stolworthy, who was deservedly given a packed slip cordon, kept the Staffordshire batsmen honest. Although the visitors' lower order collapsed, they still finished with a sizeable lead of 105 runs. As for Norfolk's spinners, Ryan Findlay wasn't allowed to settle and was expensive whilst Charlie Rogers found himself surplus to requirements altogether.

Norfolk's second innings was no more distinguished than their first. After a promising start, the top order caved in to Raza, who took his first five-wicket haul in the Championship. It is an indication of Norfolk's failure with the bat that Ethan Metcalf's innings of 30 was Norfolk's highest in the match and only Ben Wilcox topped 40 runs in the match. Set just 34 runs to win, the visitors won at a canter. But, by the time that they secured victory, I was in a taxi on my way home, muttering to myself about the good old days of Stephen Plumb. Previous to this match, Staffordshire had developed something of a 'complex' about Manor Park and rarely did themselves justice here – but that complex has surely now gone up in a puff of smoke.

Stephen Musk writes:

Visiting skipper Jack Beaumont won the toss and opted to bat, going in first himself. He attacked from the start and, after the fall of two early wickets, George Rhodes joined him and the runs flowed freely. At one point it seemed that Beaumont might get a hundred before lunch but eventually both batsmen were dismissed just before the break. Suffolk's captain faced just 115 balls for his 89. A collapse then followed, such that, in all, seven wickets went down for the addition of just18 runs. However, an annoying last wicket partnership added 38. Given a little encouragement by the pitch, spinners Ryan Findlay and Charlie Rogers shared the last eight wickets.

Noting the quality of the pitch, Beaumont opted to use the new ball himself and was rewarded when his slow left arm brought him two early wickets. In all, Norfolk's batting was most undistinguished and their backs were up against the wall by close of play. But, on the second day, Findlay's aggressive batting saw Norfolk limit their deficit to just 23 runs. His innings of 67 lasted just 75 balls and contained ten '4s' and one '6'. Seven wickets fell to Suffolk's spinners.

Going in again, Beaumont again challenged the bowling and, supported by debutant Ollie Burle, saw Suffolk reach the end of play with a lead of 118 and no wickets lost. What was lost during the day was a considerable amount of play due to early morning rain. As in the previous fixture, the standard of the covers was called into question. Luckily, the third day saw fair weather and a prompt start. Suffolk collapsed once more. They lost their nine wickets for only 58 runs, Alex Oxley being unable to bat. Brett Stolworthy bowled tirelessly and to great effect.

Norfolk were set 180 to win and, after losing two early wickets, proceeded cautiously. When they had reached 128 for four wickets with Tom New well set, they looked to be comfortable favourites as only 52 further runs were needed and they had six wickets in hand. Alas, disaster! New, Rogers (first ball), and Luke Caswell were dismissed for the addition of just four runs so the target was now 48 but with only three wickets left. There was still hope as Findlay, Callum Metcalfe, and Stolworthy can all bat. But the first two fell to very poor shots. Findlay heaved a good length ball straight down the throat of the fielder on the cowshot boundary (shades of 'Old George' Pilch perhaps?) whilst Metcalf inexplicably tried to reverse sweep a straight delivery and paid the penalty. Andy Hanby's dismissal shortly afterwards saw Norfolk fall short by an agonisingly small margin and find themselves at the bottom of the Championship table.

Close of play: Day 1 – Norfolk 61 - 4 in 23 overs (de Lucchi 3 & Wilcox 8) Day 2 – Lincolnshire 192 - 6 in 63 overs (Pocklington 25 & Joy 5)

Norfolk headed to Cleethorpes to take on Lincolnshire in their final game of the season knowing that only a win would be sufficient to keep them in Eastern Division One for another season. The hosts were one place and 12 points above Norfolk.

The Imp County won the toss and elected to bat first. Norfolk battled hard on a good wicket and had the home side 110 for 4 and then 209 for 8, as Ryan Findlay helped himself to a five-wicket haul. Opener Jaden Fell made 72 before a game changing unbroken ninth wicket partnership of 108 by skipper Tom Keast with an excellent 125 and youngster Josh Knapton with a maiden 50 as the innings wound up on 317 for 8 after 90 overs.

Norfolk were soon on the backfoot at 4 for 2 and 103 for 6. Ben Wilcox batted patiently and supported by Findlay (51) they helped take the Norfolk total to 203 when they were bowled out. Wilcox who ran out of partners ended unbeaten on 60.

For Lincolnshire there was four wickets for ex Derbyshire, Surrey and Nottinghamshire pace man Mark Footitt.

The hosts started their second knock with a first innings lead of 114. After slipping to 113 for 5 they recovered to pile the pressure on Norfolk finishing on 282 when they were all out in 95.3 overs. Jordan Cook 64, Tom Keast 40, Joe Pocklington 41 and Josh Joy 39 made sure that Norfolk would need an unlikely final innings total of 397 to stay in the division.

The highlight for Norfolk was Callum Metcalf taking his first "five for" in a Norfolk shirt. There were two wickets each for Findlay and Hanby.

Tom New announced before the start of play on the final day that he was retiring as a player from National Counties Cricket, and he made sure that he went out in style with 76 from 69 balls including fifteen four's and one six. New was the main provider in a Norfolk total of 213 as they were bowled out falling to a heavy defeat that confirmed their relegation.

Alex King had four wickets and there were three more for Footitt as Lincs secured their place in Division One.





Showcase Game - Norfolk v Nottinghamshire

Norfolk welcomed Nottinghamshire to Manor Park and whilst Head Coach Peter Moores rested Brett Hutton and Dane Paterson who had shared ten wickets when bowling out Kent on Friday for 85 they took the field with strong starting eleven. They had brought with them their full Metro Bank 50 over squad for their final warm-up game and places were up for grabs ahead of the visit to Chelmsford to take on Essex on 4th August in their opening fixture.

The large crowd saw Notts bat first after winning the toss. They got off to a good start with openers Ben Slater and Ben Martindale putting on 85 for the first wicket. Slater who had been in great form in the county championship survived a dropped catch by wicketkeeper Stephen Gray off the bowling of Andy Hanby. As Norfolk were striving for a breakthrough nineteen-year-old Will Bowman answered the call with a devastating four balls in the 18th over as he took three wickets including the prize scalp of captain Haseeb Hameed first ball. He bowled Martindale (33), had Slater (48) caught and bowled before bowling Hameed with the score on 86.

Matt Montgomery and Liam Patterson-White put on 43 for the fourth wicket as Bowman claimed his fourth victim when Freddie Fairey took an excellent catch on the edge to dismiss Patterson-White (25). Sammy King who played four games for Norfolk in this year's T20 competition joined Montgomery at the crease. The pair both showed their class as they compiled 105 with some powerful hitting. King eventually perished to a catch by Bowman off Ryan Findlay for 58 and then Findlay ran out Montgomery for an excellent 88. There was a late cameo by Dane Schadendorf (41 no) to take the final score to an imposing 312 for 6 of their 50 overs.

Bowman had the excellent figures of 4 for 46 from his ten overs.

Norfolk started their reply with Sam Arthurton and Ben Wilcox facing the pace of Toby Pettman and Tom Loten. With 17 on the board Arthurton ran himself out and was soon followed back to the pavilion by Wilcox who was caught by Slater off Loten. Norfolk was finding it a big challenge against the professional outfits attack. Gray (17), Alfie Cooper (19), Hudson De Lucchi (14) and Freddie Fairey (18) all got starts but nobody could go on to make a big score against the slow bowling of Montgomery, Fateh Singh, Calvin Harrison and Patterson-White.

It was down to Findlay who had two fours and one big six in his 22 no to lift the score into three figures. Norfolk were finally bowled out for 127.

Calvin Harrison was the pick of the bowlers with 4-27.

Peter Moores said after the game, "it was a really good exercise for us and all credit to Norfolk who put it on really well. We came here last year, it was all set up perfectly and then it rained."

Obituaries 2023

David George Pilch 2.6.1943 - 28.9.2023



David was born into a sporting family, his father George and his grandfather Reginald had both played cricket for Norfolk as had his great great uncle Fuller Pilch (1804-70) who was born in Horningtoft and was one of the first professional cricketers who also played for Kent and England.

David was a multitalented sportsman and represented Norfolk at cricket 225 times from 1961-83, second only to Michael Falcons 257 and more than 30 times at hockey, he played golf all his life and was an

accomplished squash player and skier.

He was educated at Town Close before moving to Repton School where he played with Richard Hutton. After leaving school he played for Repton Pilgrims from 1967-85 in the public schools 'Cricketer Cup' reaching the finals in 1967, 83 and 85, winning twice.

As a genuine all rounder he scored 6333 runs for Norfolk with a top score of 102* against Cambridgeshire at Lakenham in 1976, took 222 wickets with his seam bowling with a best return of 7-35 against Suffolk at Bury St Edmonds. In 1975 and took 145 catches mainly at slip, also captaining the side from 1972-75. He also captained the regional MCC team, toured South Africa twice with the 'Swallows' and played for Norwich Wanderers for over 20 years, winning the Carter Cup in 1977.

David played golf at Brancaster for over 50 years and was a member at Royal Norwich where he was captain in 1992 and the President from 2004-6.

He was a true colossus of Norfolk sport and will be sadly missed by his family, teammates and opponents.

Chris, a useful batsman and inswing bowler played for Ingham for 25 years and represented Norfolk twice in 1969, scoring 43 runs with a highest score of 27 against Suffolk. A larger than life character he also played rugby for Norwich.


A solicitor by profession, Chris was also a member of the MCC, the Lord's Taveners and a staunch member of the Catholic Church.

In retirement he also volunteered as a driver helping local hospitals, hospices, and community organisations but not in his British Racing Green E Type Jag for which he was well known locally for driving around with the top down.


